Eastern NC communities often feature underserved populations of color, socioeconomic levels, and those aging that lack access to services that are critical for physical and mental health. These communities are often labeled "food deserts" with grocery stores and physical and mental health providers miles away and public transportation scarce. Providing access to healthy food and accessible health care are of primary and immediate concern to these communities and to local and county governments and non-profit organizations wanting to bring about immediate and short-term relief.



Wellness Garden Concept

Wellness gardens are affordable and complementary community-based health care efforts to achieve a sustainable quality of life. Wellness consists of multiple integrated facets or life dimensions that foster an individual and a community's wellbeing, social connectivity, creativity and intellectual growth, physical exercise, mindfulness, in addition to sound nutritional strategies. The Wellness Gardens of Aurora are designed to be environmentally sustainable and offers activities and events that promote many of these life dimensions, such as connecting with nature, providing built spaces for community events, learning programs, and creative endeavors, accessible lighted walkways and gardening beds for physical activity, meditation commons, and more.
